Behavioral Health Adult Program



About Us

The Behavioral Health Adult program provides a wide range of services, including screenings, assessments, treatment, and referrals.

Our services are available to everyone in Lincoln County. We are located in Newport and Lincoln City.

Because we are a community specialty mental health program, we connect people with local services, support systems, and resources they need.

Our goal is to help our clients in long-term recovery and to help them keep their independence within the community.

We may provide services directly, or we may connect community members with other services that can better meet their needs.

Adult Behavioral Health also staffs several Lincoln County treatment courts.

Payment

We accept Oregon Health Plan, Medicare, and most private insurances. We provide services regardless of the ability to pay.

Our billing department will review and discuss payment options for anyone.

Our Services

We prioritize the needs of individuals with a serious and persistent mental illness, whose symptoms impact functioning in more than two areas of their life.

Intensive outpatient treatment is provided in the form of our Assertive Community Treatment Services.

Problem Gambling: If gambling causes problems or if it seems like it may become a problem for you, your family, or someone you care about, we can help.

Substance Use Disorder along with other mental health concerns: We can help if you or someone you know is having mental health struggles as well as having substance use disorder. When one or more mental health challenge is happening with someone struggling with substance use, it is called *co-occurring conditions*.

Pre-commitment help: If you are worried about someone's safety because they may be having mental health challenges, call our Crisis Line (866-266-0288) anytime. One of our crisis workers can and guide you in the next steps.

24-hour Behavioral Health Mobile Crisis Response Team

When individuals are identified as needing immediate mental health attention, this team provides assessment, support, and short-term case management services.

The team serves people who present to local hospital emergency rooms and/or who are referred to us by law enforcement (including those at the county jail).

When it is determined safe to do so, assessments occur in the community.

When indicated, the crisis team arranges for and assures coordination for higher levels of care.
