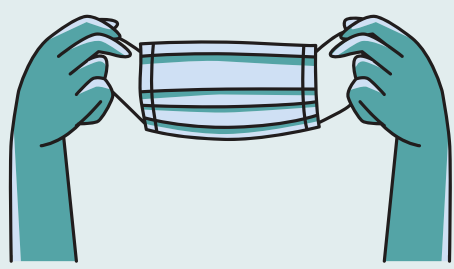

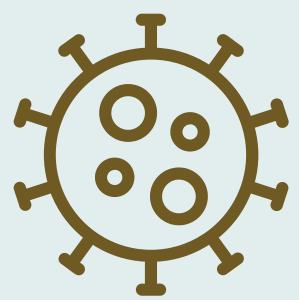

241 communicable disease reports received and managed



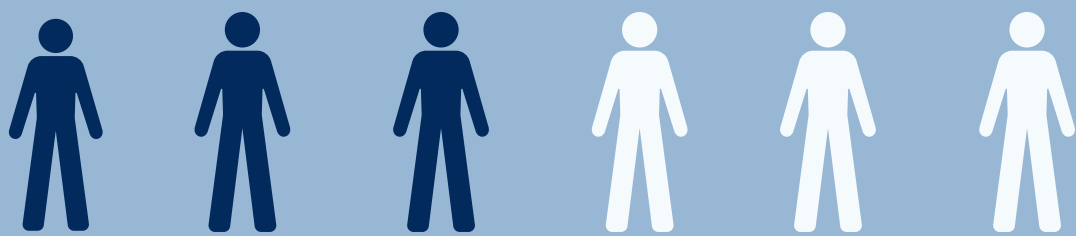
The Communicable Disease Services program provides follow-up with those who test positive for sexually transmitted diseases (STI) or a communicable disease (CD).

We provide testing, treatment and education to reduce disease spread and prevent re-infections.



4,764 confirmed COVID-19 cases reported

51% of Reportable Disease cases were investigated through phone interviews



152 COVID-19 Mobile Vaccine Clinics held, providing **4,737** vaccines

3 STI and Hepatitis C (Hep C) testing events held

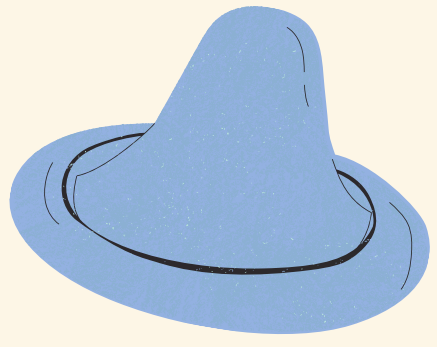
The Harm Reduction program provides syringe exchange services and free resources including overdose reversal kits, condoms, and first aid supplies. We offer rapid HIV, Hep C, and syphilis testing. We help reduce the risk of HIV, Hep C, sexually transmitted infections, and other bacterial infections.

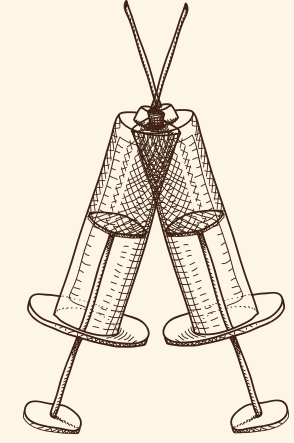

The Lincoln County Health Promotion program seeks to educate, promote, and coordinate effective community-based prevention strategies to help create a healthier community.

We collaborate with the community and stakeholders to prevent chronic disease and unhealthy behaviors. We support prevention of alcohol, drug, and tobacco use, and problem gambling. We promote mental health awareness and provide resources.

The Environmental Health program licenses Lincoln County food, pool and lodging facilities open to the public. Drinking water, emergency preparedness, vital records, and solid waste are included in the Environmental Health program. With 624 facilities licensed, we assist 47 small water systems monitoring for compliance with testing to provide safe drinking water.

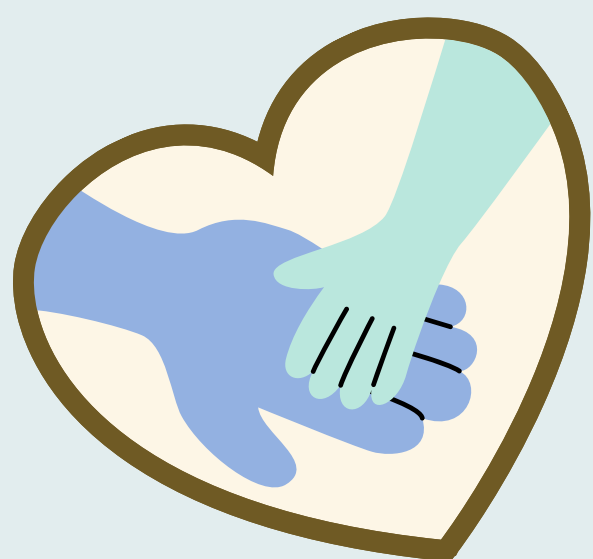

All Maternal, Child and Family Health programs are free to families and voluntary.



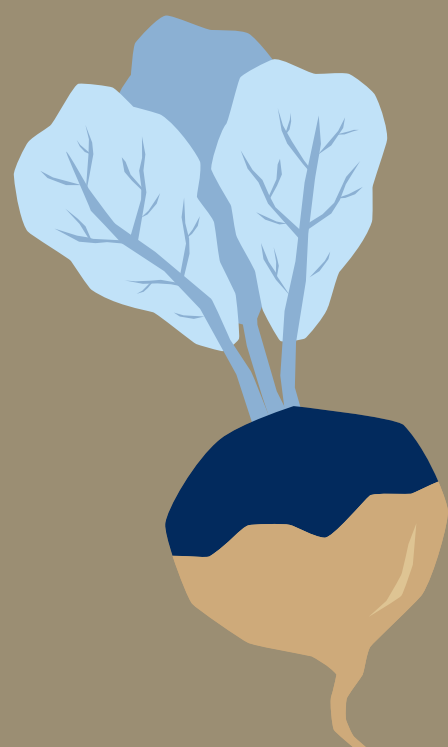
